Why the Botanical Education Trust?

South Africa represents just 1% of the earth's total land surface, but has the richest flora in the world.

Growing human populations, and their demands on the environment, are threatening this natural heritage, the last remnants of which are disappearing at an alarming rate.

How the Trust operates

The Botanical Education Trust operates under the auspices of the Botanical Society of SA (BotSoc). It is fully registered as a Trust and is audited annually. In addition it has been approved as a Public Benefit Organisation (PBO) and has been granted, by SARS, exemption from donations tax and estate duty.

This includes a Section 18A exemption certificate which permits any donor to treat donations to the Trust as a tax deductible expense.



Projects funded to date have included

- Taxonomic studies.
- Threatened and data deficient species research.
- Investigation into biological control of alien invasive plants.

The Trust also enabled learners to attend a program in the National Botanical Gardens, educating them about conservation and how to make informed environmental decisions.



Objectives of the Trust

- 1. To conserve and promote indigenous South African flora.
- **2.** To advance education and research in the field of our indigenous flora.
- **3.** To fund literature pertaining to indigenous flora and factors influencing it.
